Oak Leaf

- There are approximately 500 species of oaks.
- North America contains the largest number of oak species, with approximately 90 occurring in the United States.
 - The fruit of the oak is a nut called an acorn.



Shagbark Hickory

Leaves

- The shagbark hickory is a common hickory in the Eastern United States and southeast Canada.
 - It grows over 100 feet (30 meters) tall.
- Mature shagbarks can be recognized by their shaggy bark.



Maple Leaf

- In the early 1700s, the maple leaf had been adopted as an emblem by the French Canadians.
 - Most maple species are native to Asia.
- Maple syrup is made from the sap of some maple species.



Horse Chestnut Leaf

- The horse chestnut is a species in the soapberry and lychee family.
 - The horse chestnut is a favorite subject for bonsai.
- The horse chestnut tree is one of the symbols of Kyiv, the capital of Ukraine.



Ash Leaves

- Ash trees are in the olive and lilac family.
- Ash leaves are a critical food source for North American Frogs.
 - The seeds are a type of fruit known as a samara.
