Leopard slug

- The leopard slug gets its name from the black spots on their body.
 - They can live for up to 2.5 years.
 - They can lay up to 200 eggs at a time.



Garden snail

- It is the most common snail native to Europe but found all over the world.
- A Garden Snail will create mucus like slime as it travels, and using its single long foot they can even climb up walls on this slime!
 - It is an air breathing snail that has a single lung.



Banana slug

- Banana slugs get their name from their bright yellow color.
- Thought sometimes they can be green, brown, tan, or white.
 - They can live to up to 7 years.



Grove snail

- Unlike most snails Grove snails are either born male or female.
 - Female Grove snails lay 30 to 80 eggs in a season.
- Grove snails take 3 years from birth to be full adult snails.



Large Red slug

- Is nocturnal, which means it only comes out a night, except for when it rains.
 - The Large Red slug breathes through a hole on its head.
 - Large Red slugs lay their eggs under rocks and logs.



Roman snail

- Also known as the Burgundy snail.
- It is a big snail, whose shell is about 1.1-1.7 inches high, and about 1.1 to 1.9 inches wide.
- The Roman snail needs to consume a diet of high calcium to keep its shell hard.



Kerry slug

- Also known as the spotted slug for all of its spots.
- Kerry slugs like to live in climates of high humidity and warm summer weather.
- In its habitat the Kerry slug can morph or change colors to camouflage itself.



Moon snail

- Also known as necklace snails, are snails of the sea.
- These snails eat clams. Moon snails drill a countersunk, circular hole in the shell of their prey and then consume the soft body with their proboscis.
- The snail's soft body is large and will conceal the entire shell when it is outstretched.



Nudibranch

- Nudibranch's are slugs of the sea, also known as marine gastropod molluscs.
 - They are very brightly colored.
- Nudibranch's have a tooth called a radula, that they eat with.



Round Disc snail

- Also called the Discus snail.
- It is known for its tiny round and flat disc-like shell.
 - It lives in very moist, sheltered places.
